An Orientation Workshop on AC&ABC Scheme for New Nodal Officers

An orientation workshop on AC&ABC scheme for new nodal officers was organized on 30th October 2021 at Samanvaya Hall, National Institute of Agricultural Extension Management (MANAGE), Hyderabad. The goal of the workshop was to familiarize the new nodal officers with implementation and monitoring of the scheme in their respective states. The workshop was graced by the presence of Dr. P Chandra Shekara, Director General, MANAGE and Dr. Shahaji Phand, Principal Coordinator, AC&ABC with the entire team of AC&ABC of MANAGE, Hyderabad. The workshop was conducted for newly appointed Nodal Officers and Training Coordinators of 14 newly inducted Nodal Training Institutes from the states of Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Punjab and Tripura.



In the Inaugural address, Dr. P Chandra Shekara highlighted the achievement of the scheme and mentioned that it is the only government agricultural scheme which has been running successfully since two decades. He showed immense pleasure that with the induction of these new NTIs the scheme has now spread its reach from Kashmir to Kanyakumari and Gujarat to North-East of India. Being one of the founding members of the scheme back in 2002, Dr. P Chandra Shekara stressed upon the intricacies of the AC&BC Scheme for an effective implementation and monitoring of the scheme by the newly inducted NTIs. He shed light on proper selection of the eligible and serious candidates which is one of the most important step for the success of the training programme (TP). He called attention to timely submit the necessary documents for release of funds and highlighted upon that main goal of the scheme is not only training but handholding and establishment of the candidates as successful Agripreneurs who can become job creators rather than job seekers.



The workshop included various sessions divided into 3 different segments. The first segment witnessed a introduction to the scheme through overview and good implementing practices of AC&ABC scheme presented by Dr. Shahaji Phand, PC, AC&ABC, followed by Orientation on AC&ABC scheme by Ms. Priyanka Patra, Consultant. Later there was session on orientation of Updation of AC&ABC data in MIS portal was handled by Shri Bh. Chakardhar Rao, Project Manager (ACABC). A session on orientation of financial and account aspects of AC&ABC scheme was conducted by Shri K Uday Varma, ACABC.

The workshop also included an experience sharing session by best NTI of ACABC Scheme which was delivered by Mr. N G Kamath, Nodal Officer, KVAAF, Sangli, Maharashtra. The theme for the RTP was "Poultry Management" for established Agripreneurs under AC&ABC Scheme. A total of 82 participants had registered for the program.

Business Opportunities in Vegetable Crops

The eleventh Refresher Training Program (RTP) of FY 2021-22 was organized virtually in association with ICAR-Indian Institute of Vegetable Research (IIVR), Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh between 28th-30th October 2021. The theme for the RTP was "Business Opportunities in Vegetable Crops" for established Agripreneurs under AC&ABC Scheme. A total of 45 participants had registered for the program.



National Beekeeping and Honey Mission (NBHM)

Keeping in view the importance of beekeeping and to achieve the goal of "Sweet Revolution" the need for holistic development of beekeeping was felt. Accordingly, a new Central Sector Scheme "National Beekeeping and Honey Mission (NBHM)" for overall promotion & development of scientific beekeeping and production of quality honey & other beehive products is approved by the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Govt. of India. The scheme will be implemented through National Bee Board as a Central Sector Scheme (100% funded by Central Govt.).



The NBHM will work in coordination with other Governmental programs/schemes relating to promotion of beekeeping, viz.; Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH), Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY), Honey Mission of Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC), Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises, Ministry of Rural Development, Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Ministry of Tribal

Affairs, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, ICAR, etc., for overall promotion & development of scientific beekeeping in the country. The NBHM will provide technical guidance/ advise and administrative support to the implementing agencies at the National & State level for effective & smooth implementation of the scheme.

National Beekeeping and Honey Mission (NBHM) Sub-Missions

The NBHM has three sub-missions or sub-schemes, namely, Mini Mission - I, II and III.

- ☐ Mini Mission I: The focus is on the production and productivity enhancement of different crops through pollination aided by adopting scientific beekeeping. It aims to create awareness about scientific beekeeping. States will be assisted in the setting up of state bee boards/state beekeeping and honey missions.
- ☐ Mini Mission II: The focus is on post-harvest management of beekeeping, beehive products, including collection, processing, storage, marketing, value addition, etc.
- ☐ Mini Mission III: The focus is on the generation of research and technology for different states/regions and agro-climatic and socio-economic conditions.

MANAGE-AC&ABC Agripreneurs Webinar Series

The 9th Webinar in the series was organized on October 02nd, 2021 at 10:00 am IST. The theme for the webinar was "Providing Right Agro-Inputs at Right Time and Right Price".

Mr. Rohan R. Salokhe, Programme Coordinator, Krishna Valley Advanced Agricultural Foundation, Uttur Sub Centre, Maharashtra was the first speaker for the session. He highlighted that the NTI has trained 1,305 candidates in 38 batches. From the trained candidates, 678 candidates have gone ahead and established their own agri-ventures in different categories. The NTI has also played an instrumental role in helping 140+ candidates to get bank loan sanctioned out of which 83 projects have received subsidy from NABARD. He mentioned that the NTI focuses on establishing a good handholding rapport with all its candidates after they are established also. The NTI also actively involves all the government agencies viz. Bank and State Agri Dept in different process of training such as selection process, training, Handholding etc.

Mr. Bharat Shripati Pawar, Founder, Tarashri Seeds and Fertilizers was the second speaker for the session. A Master's Commerce and Bachelor's Agriculture, Mr. Pawar completed the AC&ABC training at from KVAAF, Uttur. He informed to the audience that first of all it is very important to decide on the agriventure they establish and then conduct market research for the same. He also highlighted that it is very important to maintain records and good relationship with customers. Mr. Pawar through his hardwork and diligence has able to achieve a bank loan of ₹20 lakh and a subsidy of ₹7.20 lakh from NABARD.



Mr. Ajinkaya A Pisal, Founder, JP Nature Care, Maharashtra was the third speaker for the session. He underwent training at KVAAF, Uttur and upon completion of training established his agri-venture. A Masters in horticulture, Mr. Pisal established JP Nature Care to produce and market "Use and Throw Seedling Trays". His team consists of 5 members who specializes in manufacturing and marketing of seedling trays, coco peat, provide landscaping and vertical gardening services and farmer consultancy services. The firm has also ventured into the sale of Dry Fruits as wholesalers. Mr. Pisal also mentioned that he actively takes part in agricultural exhibitions and radio shows. Lately, he also visits agricultural colleges and university to provide lecture on entrepreneurship development.



The 10th webinar in the series was organized on November 06th, 2021 at 10:00 am IST. The theme for the webinar was "Production Solution for Vermicompost and Mushroom Farming".
