Historic MoU with NABARD, MANAGE and HDFC to Support Agripreneurs in Country



A historic event of the signing of Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was organised on the eve of February 16<sup>th</sup> 2023, 3.00 PM at the NABARD Head Office in Mumbai to facilitate credit flow in AC&ABC scheme. The ceremony was chaired by Shri. Vivek Sinha, CGM, NABARD and represented by Dr. P. Chandra Shekara, Director General, MANAGE-Hyderabad and Shri. Sandeep Chavan, Senior Vice President as well as Shri. Ashey Agarwal, Senior Vice President, HDFC, Mumbai. The occasion was graced by Dr. Sanjay Kumar, Additional Commissioner and Shri. J. P. Yadav, Joint Director (Extension) from MoA&FW, Govt. of India. Ms. Nivedita Tiwary, GM, NABARD, Mumbai, welcomed the dignitaries, Ministry Officials, Nodal Officers and MANAGE team participated online across the country. The purpose of signing of MoU is to streamline and facilitate credit flow under the AC&ABC scheme. After signing of MoU the officials has discussed the strategies to execute MoU for benefit of agripreneurs. MANAGE-AC&ABC team will facilitate to identify the contact person from MoU signatories i.e. from NABARD, MANAGE, HDFC bank and same will send to Nodal officers in respective states. The MANAGE team will conduct monthly review meeting with all contact persons and facilitate loan process for trained candidates under AC&ABC scheme. The MoU ceremony also graced by Shri. Kameswararao Adiraju, DVP; Shri. Kanhei Dandsena, DVP; Shri. Naveen Shankar, DVP; Shri. Jayesh C Patil, AVP from HDFC bank. A total of 120 participants from the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Gol, NABARD, HDFC bank, Nodal Training Institutes, and the MANAGE-AC&ABC team were present in ceremony. Dr. Shahaji Phand, Principal Coordinator, AC&ABC, Hyderabad has coordinated the MoU Signing ceremony.

## HIGHLIGHTS OF THE UNION BUDGET (2023-24): AGRICULTURE &amp; Allied Sector



### Key Announcements for Agriculture & Allied Sector :

**Announcement 1: Increased Agriculture Credit Allocation to 20 Lakh Crores:** The agriculture credit target has increased to Rs. 20 lakh crores, with the focus on animal husbandry, dairy and fisheries about 11% higher than Union Budget 2022. In addition, 63,000 Primary Agricultural Credit Societies are being digitized with an investment of Rs. 2,516 crores.

**Impact:** The agri credit outlay and the digitization of agri credit societies are expected to enable inclusive farmer-centric solutions and help improve access to farm inputs and infrastructure.

**Announcement 2: Accelerator Agriculture Fund of INR 2,200 Cr.:** An agriculture accelerator fund to encourage agri-tech startups by young entrepreneurs in rural areas will focus on bringing innovative solutions to challenges faced by farmers. It will also bring modern technologies to transform agricultural practices and increase productivity and profitability.

**Impact:** With about INR 6,600 Cr. raised by the agri-tech startup space in the last four years, a unique accelerator fund is expected to boost the technological transformation in the agriculture sector through farmers' access to technologies, improving farm incomes.

**Announcement 3: Sub-scheme under PMMSY Scheme:** A new sub-scheme of Pradhan Mantri Matsya SAMPADA Yojana will be launched with a targeted investment of Rs 6,000 crore to further enable activities of fishermen, fish vendors, and micro and small enterprises. It will also improve value chain efficiencies and expand the market.

**Impact:** Improved access to infrastructure for the fisheries and the aquaculture sector

**Announcement 4: Improved Access to Better-quality Agri Inputs:** PM-PRANAM will be launched to incentivize states to promote alternative fertilizers. In addition, over the next three years, one crore farmers will get assistance to adopt natural farming, and 10,000 bio-input resource centers will be established. To improve the availability of disease-free and high-quality planting material for high-value horticultural crops, the Atmanirbhar Clean Plant Programme was announced with an outlay of Rs. 2,200 Cr.

**Impact:** The PM PRANAM Scheme, with the provision for bio-input resources, is expected to incentivize states, Union Territories, and farmers to promote alternative fertilizers (including organic fertilizers) and the balanced use of chemical fertilizers. Access to disease-free quality plant inputs will facilitate diversified agriculture through increased horticulture production.

**Announcement 5: Improved Access to Agri Infrastructure & Storage:** The government plans to set up massive, decentralized storage capacity to help farmers.

**Impact:** Setting up accessible storage will enable farmers to sell at an appropriate time, enhancing price realization.

Agro Expo 2023 (11<sup>th</sup> -13<sup>th</sup> February 2023) KRISHI EVAM SWASTHYA AMRIT MAHOTSAV at KVK, MADHUBANI Bihar State

On February 11-13, 2023, the Krishi Vigyan Kendra in Madhubani, Bihar State, hosted the two-day Krishi Evam Swasthya Amrit Mahotsav & Mega Agri Expo-2023 in honor of the "Year of Millets 2023." In addition to the major event, the 7th International Conference on "Sustainable Use of Resources in Agricultural Growth: Its Challenges and Opportunities" was hosted. As the event's chief guest, Director General MANAGE was invited. Agri-Expo 2023 was attended by MANAGE. Three research papers from Centre of Agri-Entrepreneurship (CAD) section -MANAGE were ultimately accepted and delivered online. Two stalls were allotted to MANAGE-Hyderabad, Total Five agripreneurs and One incubate displayed their product and services in Agri-Expo. Mr. S. K. Singh, the founder of Sawrnm Bio-Agro Science Pvt Ltd, Agripreneur, received a trophy for having the best stall. The MANAGE-ACABC stall was also given the title of Best Stall at the Agri-Expo.



National Conventions of Women Agripreneurs & Start-up Led Agricultural Development” G-20



The “National Conventions of Women Agripreneurs & Start-up Led Agricultural Development” G-20 side event on 7th February 2023 was organised by Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare (MoA&FW) New Delhi in collaboration with MANAGE-Hyderabad at State Institute of Agriculture Extension and Training (SIAET) Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh. Shri Nirupam Mehrotra, CGM, NABARD, Bhopal was the chief guest of the convention. Shri S. R. Ingle, Joint Director (Mass media) MoA&FW also grace the event as Special Guest of the convention. A total of 250 Women Agripreneurs, Start-up, and Farm women were participated from Madhya Pradesh State.

A total of five Women Agriprenurs who trained and established under AC&ABC scheme presented the success stories of their Agri-ventures. A start-up incubator from one of the MANAGE -Incubation centres also shared the tale of the success of her goods and services. Dr. Shahaji Phand Dy. Director & Principal Coordinator of AC&ABC scheme address the gathering and emphasised the significance of the Tripartite MoU signed by MNAGAE, NABARD, and SBI under the AC&ABC scheme. According to Dr. Phand, the AC&ABC model was initially adopted as a pilot project in the state of Telangana, but due to its overwhelming success, it is now being replicated in other states as well. During the convention, Memorandums of Understanding (MoU) were signed between MANAGE, NABARD, and four banks, including the Bank of India, the Central Bank of India, the State Bank of India and Madhya Pradesh Gramin Bank.

## MANAGE-AC&ABC Agripreneurs Webinar Series

The 24<sup>th</sup> Webinar in the series was organized on Saturday, January 7th 2023 at 10:30 am IST. The theme for the webinar was **“Farm Mechanization and Farmers Producer Organization: Reforming the Country’s Farming Pattern & Ensuring Food Security”**.

The ACABC-Team gave a hearty welcome to all participants from India’s 9 states before the webinar began. Mr. Dattatray Gosavi, Nodal Officer of KVAAF-Pune, led the opening session. According to the speaker’s introduction, Krishna Valley Advanced Agricultural Foundation-Pune in collaboration with MANAGE and the Gol, started providing entrepreneurial training under the ACABC Scheme in 2013. The 30 training batches that were successfully finished resulted in the training of 1009 agri-professionals and the encouragement of 544 others to start agricultural business, yielding a success percentage of 53.91% Additionally, he underlined the importance of providing hand-holding assistance to agripreneurs so they may established Agri-ventures without any problems. He went on to suggest that the trainees’ determination to start agri-business was probably a significant element in the success of the AC&ABC scheme. Together with NABARD and officials of Nationalized banks, the NTI also actively arranges a number of workshops for the AC&ABC.

The second speaker was Mr. Subhash Kakade, the founder of Kakade Agro Equipment. Mr. Kakde is a master in agriculture engineering. After completing a training progame under the AC&ABC scheme, his dream of manufacturing farmers’/user-friendly farm equipment for the farming community came true. said Kakade. Kakade elaborated on the various sprayers and other equipment throughout his presentation. He emphasized that the economics and plant geometry should be taken into consideration when choosing a sprayer. He also concentrated on the operation and maintenance of the farm machinery so one may keep machinery in good condition for extended duration. He also provided safety advice for using farm equipment.

Mr. Kunal Tushar Shelar (M.Sc. Agri), the founder of "Jadgaon Farmer Producer Company Limited," spoke before the final session. Beginning his presentation, Mr. Selar provided a detailed profile of the Jadgaon FPO. He described the FPO’s primary function as well as its principal product in detail. Onions and sweet corn were chosen as the two principal crops by the Jadgaon FPO. In order to provide the farmer members with technical guidance, Mr. Shelar has created a comprehensive set of procedured for both the crops and extension services. He claimed that the FPO’s primary activity is providing extension services, which aid in building strong relationships with farmers. He concluded by describing in detail the FPO registration process and the accompanying paperwork needed for it.
