NABARD Plays key role in sensitization of Tamil Nadu bankers on Agri Clinics and Agri Business Centres Scheme

NABARD organized a State-level workshop on AC&ABC Scheme at its Tamil Nadu Regional Office, Chennai, on 26th November, 2012 and a District-level work shop at Tiruvannamalai on 3rd January, 2013.

State-level work shop was organized to popularize the scheme among bankers and Agri professionals and to discuss various issues to take the scheme forward. A total of 45 representatives of Commercial banks, State Level Bankers Committee (SLBC), MANAGE, Nodal training institutes (NTIs) of Tamil Nadu such as Voluntary Association for People Service (VAPS) and National Agro Foundation (NAF), along with their Agripreneurs, had participated.

The DGM, NABARD emphasized the significance of AC&ABC scheme and the purpose of the workshop. The GM, while enlightening the participants on the decisions taken during the National review workshop on AC&ABC on 07-08-12, emphasized that the financing bank should communicate the status of the loan application to the candidates within 15 days. He urged the bankers to bring all the relevant circulars to the notice of all branch managers. Shri Ram Reddy, Consultant, MANAGE, presented the scheme and loan pendency issues in Tamilnadu.

It was established in the year 2008 with a mission to be the premier source for quality polytechnic education, training and professional certification to serve the needs and advancement of the excellence of technical education and industries worldwide. It offers six diploma courses in various disciplines of engineering - Mechanical (DME), Civil (DCE), Electronics & Communication (DECE), Tool & Die Making (DT&D), Refrigeration & Air Conditioning (DR&AC) and Automobile Engineering (DAE)

Out of these, Tiruvannamalai Agripreneurs Association for Input-Supply (TAAI) has come out with a unique idea to support financially weak trainees to start Agriventures and Agro tourism under the overall guidance of RPC.

Shri. Anshul Misra, IAS, the former District Collector of Tiruvannamalai, and Shri. Vijay Maruti Pigale, IAS, the present District Collector, interacted with TAAI, appreciated its efforts and wished that TAAI expand its scale and spread by training and establishing successfully many more Agricultural professionals. RPC is further planning to increase the success rate by introducing innovative models and refining the existing models.

Handholding Activities:

- Nodal officer guides all the trainees to examine the possibilities of viable ventures along with the family/guardian.
- Makes regular visits to banks either personally or along with the Agripreneur to convince the bankers on the viability of pending AC&ABC Projects.
- Organized a One-day Workshop for the trainees of the earlier batches on 3rd February,2013 and bankers were invited to discuss the issues and to guide the Agripreneurs.

Mr.Murugan, Nodal officer, National Agro Foundation (NAF) and Mr. Arul, Nodal officer, Voluntary Association for People Service (VAPS), raised a few issues in implementing the scheme as indicated below:

- Insisting of margin money by banks for loans even up to Rs. 5 lakhs despite relaxation as per guidelines.
- Lack of awareness among branch managers about the AC&ABC scheme guidelines.
- Agri graduates are switching over to employment or other fields due to delay in release of funds.

DGM, NABARD, responded stating that as per the guidelines, margin money need not be insisted for loans up to Rs. 5 lakhs. He advised the Agripreneurs and NTIs to bring such situations to the notice of NABARD so that they could take up the matter with RBI. DGM, NABARD also stated that the scheme guidelines were forwarded to all the controlling offices of the banks with a request to circulate among bank branches. SLBC convener informed the participants that a separate cell was in existence for AC&ABC Scheme in Indian Overseas Bank (IOB). He has taken note of the suggestion to include AC&ABC as one of the Agenda items of the SLBC meetings.

NABARD also organized a district-level workshop on 3rd January 2013 at Tiruvannamalai to create awareness among bankers and Agripreneurs. The participants are representatives from SBI, Indian Bank, Karur Vysya Bank, Central Cooperative Bank, IOB, Canara Bank, Pallavan Grama Bank, Corporation Bank, Joint Director of Agriculture (JDA), Tiruvannamalai, Nodal Training Institute and Agripreneurs. Mr. C. Sekar, LDM, Indian Bank, Tiruvannamalai exhorted the bank managers to provide necessary impetus to the Scheme by entertaining the applications of genuine candidates trained under the AC&ABC Scheme. Mr. Sudharshan, AGM, NABARD, Tiruvannamalai, besides explaining the scheme details, also appreciated the efforts of NTI behind the AC&ABC Scheme.
